Dear Friends,

I returned from Uganda in early March just as COVID-19 was beginning to surge in New York. Within 2 weeks, we had closed our offices and UWP's Board of Directors and I were talking through worst-case scenarios for the organization. The storm of COVID-19 had arrived and no one knew how long it would last or how best to weather it.

We prepared for hard times but resolved to continue to bring safe water to communities in East Africa as quickly as possible with whatever funding we had. Our staff leaned into the quarantine: We built relationships with Ugandan government officials who were stuck at home and finally ready to take our calls. We completely redesigned our website to improve communication, simplifying how the public can learn about our mission and join us in bringing safe water to Uganda. We found new supporters eager to help others in trying times.

The resulting impact of 2020 was nothing short of confounding. Rather than struggling to survive, we celebrated growth like never before. We hired new staff, expanded our field operations, installed more water projects, built more partnerships, raised more funding, and saw more Ugandan men, women, and children have access to safe water than ever before. How this happened is the best part of the story. . . it happened because of you!

Every dollar you gave, post you shared, email you replied to, prayer you prayed, and encouragement you invested into the Ugandan Water Project this year resulted in miraculous outcomes in the lives of 53,000 people we served in Uganda. We look forward to the year ahead and invite you to continue creating a better future with all of the UWP Tribe.

To our donors, volunteers, and partners, thank you for joining us in our COVID-19 response.


Because of your support, our team was able to execute a thorough assessment of 100+ health facilities' water needs, install clean water projects at 9 Ugandan health facilities, and secure funding for 10 more. These projects are now providing clean water access to more than 19,000 patients each month, including 2,415 new mothers and infants, across the 9 facilities.
